In addition, there is an instant collage function that helps you easily create a collage of your photos and a one-handed mode that brings all the controls of the camera to the bottom of the display. Alcatel is available in a trio of 1 colors (black, blue and gold) and supports 4G LTE connectivity. Keep in mind that this is an international tool, which means it doesn't come with warranty and there may be some connection problems in rural areas or crowded buildings. It is also available in two colors including a sleek black and gorgeous blue. Powering the Blade L8 is a quad-core processor, 1GB RAM and 2,000 mAh battery. You get 16GB of storage right from the box, and if you need to, you can expand it up to 128GB with a microSD card. There is a 5MP front-facing camera as well as an 8MP rear camera for all your selfies.
